WHAT DO YOU WANT ME TO DO FOR YOU? PART 3

WELCOME

Welcome all members who are joining the Homecell and online.

WORSHIP

Prepare Praise and Worship for the Homecell gathering (1 Praise & 2 Worship songs).

WORD

Matthew 20:32 NKJV

So Jesus stood still and called them, and said, "What do you want Me to do for you"

This is one statement with 3 parts:

1. What do you want? (speaks of man's desire)
2. Me to do (speaks of God's desire)
3. For you (speaks of purpose)

Ps. Aidan concluded his series this week with the third part "FOR YOU".

Jesus did not open blind eyes or fill fisherman's nets or call His disciples to follow Him without purpose.

There is no Christianity without purpose! Therefore, there is no recovery without purpose!

Ask a cell member to read Acts 9:6a

So he, trembling and astonished, said, "Lord, what do You want me to do?"

Q: What does Paul's response have to do with recovery?

- Every outcome, miracle, breakthrough, provision, healing or deliverance received from Jesus after being asked the question, "What do you want me to do for you?" must be reciprocated with the same question back to Jesus.

Ask a few cell members to read Romans 1:14 and Matthew 6:19-21

Q: What do you think of when you hear the word, "debt"?

- Debt can be defined as a sum of money that is owed or due
- Debt also means a feeling of gratitude for a service or favour
- Paul was saying, 'I am forever in your debt Jesus. If not for You, where would I be?'
- Many well-meaning Christians are more committed to their debt to their earthly bank than their commitment to the debt to their heavenly bank

Ask a cell member to read Mark 4:14-20

Q: How do these four types of soil represent the way Christians respond to fulfilling their purpose?

- The first group are those who have lost or forgotten their purpose, or treat their salvation by the way
- The second group never take the time to establish themselves, they live in a world of instant gratification
- The third group get caught up in the daily grind of life
- The fourth group are the ones that God can count on. They show up in season and out of season, they faithfully give and serve regardless of their feelings

Ask a cell member to read Galatians 2:20-11

Jesus's purpose activates our purpose on earth!

Ask a few cell members to read these Scriptures.

For each, discuss how the purpose of each person was activated by Jesus' purpose.

1. **Luke 4:18a** ("*The Spirit of the LORD is upon Me, because He has anointed Me To preach the gospel to the poor*") **and Luke 19:8-10** (Zacchaeus)
2. **Luke 4:18b** ("*He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted*") **and Matthew 27:61** (Mary)
3. **Luke 4:18c** ("*To proclaim liberty to the captives*") **and John 19:39-40** (Nicodemus)
4. **Luke 4:18d** ("*And recovery of sight to the blind*") **and John 9:17, 24-25** (The blind man)
5. **Luke 4:18e** ("*To set at liberty those who are oppressed*"), **Luke 22:62 and John 21:17** (Peter)

Ask a cell member to read Matthew 20:34

Q: What did you give most time and energy to this week? And how about the past 12 months?

Q: What have you once committed to doing that you stopped doing?

Q: What has Jesus done for you? What are you going to do for Him?

Ask a cell member to read Matthew 11:28-30

Jesus's yoke is easy, and His burden is light! When we ask God what we can do for Him we will be energised with purpose!

There is no recovery without purpose!
