WELCOME

Welcome all members who are joining the Homecell online.

WORSHIP

Challenge cell members to spend a few minutes in Worship before your ZOOM/Online Homecell starts. This will create the right atmosphere for your time together.

WORD

Matt. 20:32 NKJV

So Jesus stood still and called them, and said, "What do you want Me to do for you?"

Last week Ps Aidan started a new series "What do you want Me to do for you?" It speaks of man's desire, of God's desire and of confession. We can or reject it, neglect it or accept it. When we become serious about God and the things of God we see change in our life.

Today we look at the second part "**Me to do**" that speaks of God's desire for His children.

Q: Did you know that God is ready 24/7/365 to respond to the desires and cries of His children who know what they want?

Ask a few homecell members to read Is. 50:2, Luke 8:43-44, John 21:6 and Matt. 14:18-20

Q: What are you believing God for today?

- God has the authority to do anything
- Heaven cries out and we must respond
- God can do a miracle
- God will supply all my needs
- Jesus says, I am the God of more than enough

Ask a homecell member to read Heb. 11:6 and Matt. 20:30

Q: Why does it sometimes feel that Jesus is not coming through for me like I saw He did for the people in scripture

- Delayed recovery is often because what we seek and not who we seek
- So often we seek the hand of God first and not the heart of God
- We need to be seekers of God for who He is and not what He can do for us
- We see that the blind men went on a mission to first seek Jesus before they could see Jesus
- The woman with the issue of blood touched (substance) first then the matter followed

The difference between substance and matter

- Substance is who God is and matter is what is formed through and from substance
- We will recover all by seeking first the Kingdom of God and Jesus (substance) (Matt. 6:33)
- And then all things are added (matter)

Throughout scripture we see Jesus making this distinction between substance and matter.

Ask a few homecell members to read:

- **Matt. 6:24** – you cannot serve God (substance and mammon (matter
- **Rom. 1:25** – come to God for who He is.
- **Acts 17:28** – in Him we live and breath
- **John 1:3** – God is substance through whom matter is formed
- Without the substance (Jesus) there can be no matter
- Substance never changes, it does not decrease with hard times nor increase with good times
- **1 John 4:8** - Substance just is, substance is not trying to be
- **Heb. 11:1** – when we place a demand on God (substance) through our faith it brings unseen things (matter into our seen world
- There is nothing in the world that substance cannot penetrate. Substance is in all, over all, through all, and under all.

Ask a homecell member to read Matt. 6:28-30

Q: What do you want Me to do?

- What matters to God is your heart
- Why are you worried? Look at the flowers their trust is fully in me as they know exactly who I am. Below the soil God just sustain them
- That is why so many people struggle to surrender to Jesus because they haven't allowed Him to penetrate their hearts of stone

Ask a homecell member to read Ezek. 36:26-27 and Heb. 11:6

- God is waiting right now, right here for you to reach out to Him, by faith
- Just put your trust in Him
