WELCOME

Welcome all members who are joining the Homecell and online.

WORSHIP

Prepare Praise and Worship for the Homecell gathering (1 Praise & 2 Worship songs).

WORD

Ecclesiastes 5:3 NKJV

"For a dream comes through much activity, and a fool's voice is known by his many words."

Last week we looked at dreaming again; believing God again for the valley of dry bones to live. Once you've made up your mind to set out on achieving your vision and your dream, now you have to work your dream.

- The only time success comes before work is in the dictionary
- Achieving a dream requires hard work consistently over time
- For a dream to work you need to work your dream
- Talk is cheap but achieving your dream will cost you much

Ask a cell member to read John 9:4

Jesus himself said he needed to work his vision and dream. "Works" in Greek is business or employment. Jesus said he must work the business of his Father. In the same way we are enlisted in the army of God to expand God's kingdom.

Ask a cell member to read Luke 2:49-50

Very often when you begin working your dream people won't always understand. And that's often the reason people never see their dreams manifest - because they're trying harder to justify or explain their decision instead of working their dream.

You get two kinds of dreamers – Talkers and Walkers. The difference is only one letter.

The 3 T's of Talkers

1. Take

Ask a cell member to read Luke 15:12

- Often people want the platform or the promotion without the process
- Don't become anxious and want to take something prematurely – stick it out!
- The same thing the prodigal son thought would give him freedom ended up enslaving him

2. Tempted

Ask a cell member to read Mark 4:18-19

- A tree takes time before it bears fruit, and this is if it isn't uprooted
- Learn to persevere in the process, stay faithful
- Don't be tempted away from the things of God (Matt 13:22)

3. Tantrums

Ask a few cell members to read Matthew 20:1-16 and Matthew 10:9-10 (MSG)

- Don't compare yourself to others
- Don't throw tantrums or be easily offended
- Be the standout person at work, watch how you deal with those things
- Be careful of making excuses, God has given you everything you need for success – you are the equipment!

The 3 W's of Walkers

1. Work

Ask a few cell members to read Matthew 25:19-21, Nehemiah 4:6 and Proverbs 22:29

- Be a builder in life, bring solutions to problems
Be first to arrive and last to leave
- Let your dream live in the difficult place, like Joseph did

2. Wait

Ask a cell member to read Galatians 6:9

- Greatest is he who serves
- What you make happen for other people, God will make happen for you
- Be seed-minded not need-minded
- David was faithful in the back side of the desert, slaying the lion and the bear

3. Worship

Ask a cell member to read Luke 5:4-8

- Never doubt the faithfulness of God

You have to work your dream! Be a Walker, not a Talker!

WORKS

Choose one of the four pillars, based on the need of the Homecell, to teach during works. Please see to it that teachings address the lack of the Homecell. Conclude Homecell with prayer.

1. DISCIPLESHIP

Equip HC in basic doctrine (*Water baptism/ Tongues/ Serving/ Tithing/ Honour/ Vision*)

3. CARE

Assess the needs (*emotionally, physically, and spiritually*) of Homecell members as well as people in our immediate reach. How can we as a HC meet the needs of our HC members as well as the needs of our immediate world?

4. PRAYER

Break up in groups of 2-3 and pray over needs identified and pray for world as well.
