PREPARING FOR INVASION 2026: An Invasion of God's Love

5 November 2025

Welcome all members who are joining the Homecell!

Start by asking members who would like to share, what stood out for them from this week Sunday's sermon?

**Ask a homecell member to read:
SCRIPTURE VERSES 2 Corinthians 3:6**

Question 1: What does it mean to you personally that God has *qualified* you as a minister of a new covenant?

- We are qualified by what Jesus has done, not by our performance or perfection.
- The new covenant is led by the Spirit, not by rules/ the law that bring guilt and pressure.
- Every believer is called to carry God's love into their everyday world.

**Ask a homecell member to read:
SCRIPTURE VERSE John 3:16–17**

Question 2: How does understanding God's love for the *whole world* change the way we see ourselves and others?

- God's love is inclusive and generous, reaching every culture, background, and person.
- Jesus came to bring life, not to bring condemnation or shame.
- As recipients of this love, we are called to reflect it to others without judgment on where they are positioned.

**Ask a homecell member to read:
SCRIPTURE VERSE: Romans 5:17–19**

Question 3: How does knowing that Jesus brings *life* (not just forgiveness) shape how we live daily?

- Sin brought death, but Jesus' obedience brings life and restoration.
- Our role is not to increase people's guilt, but to offer them life in Christ.
- Being alive in Christ gives us confidence, hope, and a future.

**Ask a homecell member to read:
SCRIPTURE VERSE Hebrews 8:13**

Question 4: What difference does it make to know that the old, burdensome covenant was made obsolete and replaced by a better one?

- The old covenant of law and punishment could not bring freedom.
- Jesus fulfilled the law and removed its power to condemn us.
- We now live led by the Spirit, not trapped by fear or constant rule-keeping.

**Ask a homecell member/s to read:
SCRIPTURE VERSES Hebrews 4:16 & Hebrews 10:14**

Question 5: How can we live more boldly and confidently because of what Jesus has already completed?

- We can approach God confidently, knowing we are fully accepted.
- Jesus' sacrifice made us complete and holy forever.
- Our confidence grows as we rest in God's grace, not our own efforts.

CHALLENGE/REFLECTION:

- This week, take time to reflect on whether you are living from a place of *sonship* or from a place of striving.
- Ask yourself: Am I resting in God's love, or am I still trying to earn it?
- Choose one area of your life where you will intentionally trust the Spirit to lead you instead of relying on fear or performance.

Works (Living It Out)

- Look for one practical way this week to show God's love to someone in your workplace, family, or community.
- Replace negative self-talk or condemnation with Scripture-based truth about who you are in Christ.
- Pray daily: "Holy Spirit, lead me today as a minister of the new covenant."

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1. **PRAYER** - Take time to pray for (1) lost & prodigals on your prayer or target lists (2) One another (lay hands 1-1 or groups of 2-3)
 2. **CARE** - As a HC, identify urgent needs (among people in your immediate world) - food needs, people who are staying alone, marriage challenges, financial needs, business, career, employment needs, emotional needs etc.). How can we meet those needs?
 3. **DISCIPLESHIP** - Equip HC in Basic Doctrine (Water Baptism, Tongues, Serving, Giving, Honour, Vision)
 4. **EVANGELISM** - Equip HC in reaching their world (Build relationship with Oikos, Identify Man of Peace, Share Your Verbal Witness, Invite to Church & HC)
