GOD'S GREATEST VISION IS YOU

15 February 2026

WELCOME

Welcome all members who are joining the Homecell! Icebreaker 10-15 mins

WORSHIP

Please set up 1 praise song and 1 worship song. End Worship in prayer.

WORD

Start by asking members who would like to share, what stood out for them from this week Sunday's sermon?

- God's vision is people – He loves the world (humanity, you) so much that Jesus came to save, not condemn
- Internal transformation through belief starts here; external vision flows from receiving this love

Ask a homecell member to read: John 3:16-17

Q: How does knowing God "so loved the world" (including you personally) change how you view yourself and your worth?

A: God's love is unconditional and initiating—He loved us while we were broken, so our value isn't earned by performance.

Q: Where does condemnation (v. 17) often come from and how can this verse speak into that?

A: Condemnation often comes from past failures or comparison; the verse reminds us Jesus came to save, not judge—inviting us to internal healing first.

Q: How can receiving God's non-condemning love help prioritize internal growth over rushing into external goals?

A: Rushing external vision (e.g., business, ministry) without internal wholeness leads to burnout; receiving salvation love builds character that sustains success.

- God's heart is for people – salvation is the ultimate vision, so our dreams should aim to see others saved/blessed too
- We can extend this non-condemning love to others through grace-filled conversations, forgiveness and encouragement rather than criticism

Ask homecell members to read: Matthew 6:19 & Matthew 16:26

Q: How does this verse challenge our culture's definition of success?

A: Culture says "more = happy"; Bible says eternal focus brings lasting joy and sustains vision.

Q: In what ways can focusing on eternal/kingdom treasures free us to pursue God's vision for people?

A: Kingdom treasures (loving/serving people) align with God's vision; they endure and leave a lasting impact.

Q: Why does God care more about your internal transformation than your achievements?

A: God's vision is you—whole and transformed; external success without this is empty.

- Don't prioritize external material treasures over internal peace and relationships; true vision values people and kingdom impact over earthly accumulation.
- External pursuits without internal peace causes strife and might lead to burnout
- Helping others, being generous, prioritizing time for church, family & friends are more satisfying than accumulating earthly things

Ask a homecell member to read: Psalm 139:13-14; 1 Timothy 4:12-16 NKJV

Q: How does knowing God knit you together dismantle feelings of inadequacy?

A: You are intentionally made—you find your value from being created by God, not performance.

Q: How does “take heed to yourself” relate to God's vision starting internally?

A: God prioritizes your character – internal first: character/doctrine before external ministry/business.

Q: How does personal internal growth enable you to “save” (help/bless) others?

A: A strong, healthy you blesses others—solves problems, models faith.

- Don't allow fear, labels from people or busyness cause you to neglect your gift
- Stir up your gift by serving others

Q: What role does homecell/church community play in your internal growth (gift/vision)?

A: Through prayer, support and accountability community can serve as a strong encourager and reminder to not neglect the gift God has placed on the inside.

- Gifts serve people – business/vision should employ/empower others, reflecting God's people focused vision
- You're a victor, not victim — solve problems with God-given wisdom; your life adds value to church, family, society.

CHALLENGE/REFLECTION:

Remember: Internal growth/health enables external impact – a revelation of God's love for you leads to you loving your world – let's invite our unreached worlds to church on Sunday so they can encounter the love of Jesus for themselves! #WinTheLostAtAnyCost

WORKS

Ask a homecell member to read: Habakkuk 2:2-3 NKJV

Q: Why does God instruct us to “write the vision and make it plain”? How have you seen this principle work in your life/business?

A: Write vision plainly for clarity, motivation, and accountability — so you can "run" when reading it; it will speak in due time.

- Especially while the vision “tarries”, in the waiting season your church community is of great help to endure until the “appointed time”
- In the new covenant context, we're led by the Spirit (not external law/visions) but principle remains: clarify & write down what desires/dreams God has placed on the inside

- The ultimate vision is fulfilled in Christ; our visions should point to blessing people just as God's vision did in Christ

[CALL TO ACTION]: Write down personal internal visions/goals you are trusting God for in 2026 and can share with homecell group for prayer & accountability. Homecell leaders/top-structure revisit Homecell Goals with group and encourage to run with it!
