WELCOME

Welcome all members who are joining the Homecell!

WORSHIP

Please set up 1 praise song and 1 worship song. End Worship in prayer.

WORD

Start by asking members who would like to share, what stood out for them from this week Sunday's sermon?

Ask a homecell member to read: Romans 8:17 NKJV; Romans 6:5-7

Q: The Bible says we are co-seated, co-heirs and co-resurrected with Christ, how does this understanding shape your relationship with God?

A: This understanding is the foundation from which we should build our relationship with God. First understanding our true identity in Christ (letting go of an orphan mindset).

Q: What does co-heirs and co-resurrected mean to us as believers?

A: Being co-crucified means that our old life, our old identity is gone and we are no longer bound by our past. Being co-resurrected means that we too can walk in the newness of life with Him, that we are free. Being co-heirs with Christ means that we are spiritually seated with Him and therefore have access to a relationship with the Father. We are able to have wisdom, guidance and the leading of the Holy Spirit.

Ask homecell members to read: Ephesians 2:13

Q: You know that you are seated with Christ but you are still sitting at the table with an orphan mindset. What labels or circumstances are you carrying that keeps you in that mindset?

A: Get members to answer from a personal perspective.

Ask homecell members to read: Romans 8:14, John 10:27

Q: Being led by the Holy Spirit is part of our inheritance we receive when we become sons through Christ. What makes you resist the leading of the Holy Spirit?



A: A lack of trust in His leading. Trusting the leading of the Spirit comes through yielding and learning how to trust His voice instead of our limited knowledge. Trust and time are intertwined together. So a greater sense of trust comes through more intentional time spent. We need to value our time spent with the Holy Spirit. That will lead to a better understanding of how He speaks and leads us personally.

Ask a Homecell member to read, Philippians 1:6 Philippians 4:19, 2 Corinthians 9:10

Q: What is the difference between a scarcity and supply mindset?

A: Scarcity mindset runs on “I must do everything myself” where supply mindset is being confident that God is my source and therefore I can rest and give.

Q: How does knowing God will complete the work that He started (Philippians 1:6) free us from striving?

A: Paul’s full persuasion led to unwavering confidence and trust that God is in control. That enabled him to be free, to endure and to be a generous person.

Ask a Homecell member to read, Acts 20:35

Kingdom consumer vs Kingdom contributor

We all have a seat at the table, but are we just eating or are we helping serve the table too? Are you showing up to the table when the food is ready or are you helping prepare the food?

Q: How does practically contributing to church look like?

Consumer mindset vs Contributor mindset:

- Coming to church vs coming to church and serving in a ministry
- Going to homecell vs going to help set up/ prepare
- Going to church without community vs pouring into people
- Giving when it’s comfortable vs living generously

Q: How do we shift into a contributor mindset? A: The gospel will activate generosity within your heart. Spend time developing your generosity by getting involved in serving ministries.
